

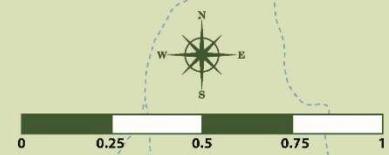


# HEYBURN STATE PARK

## Heyburn State Park - Northside Trails

### Lakeshore Trail -- 0.6 miles – Easy

Lakeshore Trail begins at Hawley's Landing Campground and takes you to the beautiful boardwalks of the Plummer Marsh Wildlife Viewing Area. To make an easy 1.1 mile loop, cross Chatcolet Road near the Plummer Creek bridge. Watch for cars, as there is no crosswalk. Follow the maintenance road beyond the gate until you see signs directing you to the left to continue the trail.

### Plummer Creek Fire Trail -- 1.6 miles – Easy

Plummer Creek Fire Trail is a shady flat walk on the south side of Plummer Creek. The trail begins at Plummer Marsh Boardwalk and ends at the park boundary. The only bridge crossing of Plummer Creek is the Chatcolet Road bridge at the parking area.

### CCC Nature Trail – 1 mile loop – Easy

The CCC Nature Trail loop begins at the Indian Cliffs Trailhead and makes a loop using part of Indian Cliffs Trail. Grab a pamphlet and learn about our CCC heritage and natural world on this trail built by the CCC in 1935.

### Indian Cliffs Trail – 3 mile loop – Rating – Moderate

Beginning at the Indian Cliffs Trailhead, this scenic hike makes a 3-mile loop. You will enjoy panoramic views of the lower St. Joe flowing between Chatcolet Lake and Round Lake and into Lake Coeur d'Alene, and the confluence where Plummer Creek joins them through Plummer Marsh. East up the St. Joe you can see Benewah Lake and the Bitterroot Mountain Range on the Montana border.

### Mullan Trail – 1.5 Miles – Rating – Moderate

Mullan Trail begins at the Chatcolet Day Use Area and connects to Shoeffler Butte Loop, combining for a challenging 5-mile, 1200 ft hike. This trail is a section of the original Mullan Road. This part was only used in 1859 by the army because of flooding, but use continued for around 75 years for locals, until construction of the Heyburn Highway (now Chatcolet Road) by the CCC.

### Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes – 72 miles – Easy

The Trail of the Coeur d'Alene's is a 72-mile rails-to-trails paved recreation corridor, winding from Plummer to Wallace, along many creeks, rivers, and lakes. The focal point at Heyburn is the trestle bridge where it crosses the St. Joe, and where Chatcolet and Coeur d'Alene Lakes combine, just 1/2 mile from the parking lot at Chatcolet.

### Shoeffler Butte Loop – 2.2 miles – Moderate

Accessed at the far north entrance of the park on Conkling Road, or from the Mullan Trail, this loop winds up to the highest point in Heyburn and the location of a historical fire lookout. Views to the south end of Lake Coeur d'Alene and the most northeastern parts of the Palouse are visible from the butte's peak.

### Cedar Loop – 1.5 miles – Rating – Difficult

Cedar Loop begins at Rocky Point Day Use Area. The trail starts to the south of Rocky Point Lodge, climbing up and crosses Highway 5. **THERE IS NO CROSSWALK. VEHICLES CAN NOT STOP, CROSS HW-5 AT OWN RISK!** Cedar Loop climbs the ridge up Rocky Point to a vista on the bluff above, tying in with Southside Trails.
