



Heyburn State Park Marina Project

The Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation will implement significant changes to marina services. While still in the planning stage, the project invovles one, and possibly two, new marinas. The full extent and timing of the project depends on available funding. Work could begin in late 2024.

Changes are being made to ...

- * Increase the number of slips and satisfy the growing demand.
- * Address aging structures, sedimentation. noxious weeks, shoreline loss.
- * Enhance the shoreline to improve public access.
- * Create a new, sustainable business model that supports operations, maintenance, and an improved user experience.

Impacts: The marina upgrade will require the removal of existing boat garages and cabin lease docks. The changes satisfy the terms of the 1911 deed to the state and the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruling that requires Heyburn to be managed as a public park. Lessees impacted by the change will receive priority for slips at the new marina(s).

Input: Comments can only be taken in writing until the Idaho Park and Recreation Board meeting on May 13, 2024, when testimony will be taken. The board meeting will occur at 8 a.m., Pacific Time, on May 13, 2024 at the North Region Office, Roosevelt Room, 2885 Kathleen Ave., Coeur d'Alene, ID
