

# Camper Cabins



**Heyburn State Park** is the oldest state park in the Northwest, created in 1908, and is 8,000 acres. The park encompasses the south end of Lake Coeur d'Alene waters of historical Hidden Lake, Chatcolet Lake, and Benewah Lake with the shady St Joe running through its waters. Highway 5 runs along the south border of the water, just 6 miles east of Plummer, Idaho and 12 miles west of St. Maries, Idaho, with nearby hospitals and grocery stores. Most important, recreation opportunities are everywhere; hiking, birdwatching, horseback riding, biking, boating, waterskiing, sailing, canoeing and fishing are all popular pursuits. Trails for the hiker, biker and horseback rider are often shaded by 300-year-old Ponderosa and White Pines.

For those who understand that a day isn't enough, Heyburn has campgrounds, cabins, cottages, and a lodge to help make sure your entire clan has a place to lay their heads after a day of fun. Campground information is available in another brochure.



**Osprey** and **Blue Heron** Cabins are one room, 12' x 12' sleeper cabins located directly off the Trail of the Coeur d'Alenes. Each cabin sleeps up to five people on a futon and a bunk bed with full base and twin top. Amenities include electric heat/air, an inside card table with benches for stormy weather, a microwave, coffee pot, picnic table, fire pit with grill, and a porch swing. The cabins are located near central water and vault toilets. The Osprey Cabin is ADA accessible. Bring your own bedding, pillows, and all other personal use items. The Cabins are located 1.6 miles north down Chatcolet Road from our Visitor Center, on the right.

## Cottages

With **Lakeview**, **Rocky Point**, and **Keepers Cottages** you have several options for family events. All three sleep up to eight people with two bedrooms. They have full kitchens, bedrooms, restrooms, dining areas, and living rooms. Amenities include a full-sized fridge, range, oven, cooking and serving ware, plus more depending on facility. Renters must supply their own kitchen and bath towels, pillows, linens, and toiletries.



**Lakeview Cottage:** Turn off Highway 5 onto Hawley's Landing Road just 500 feet east of the Visitor Center, stay to the right. This cabin has an enclosed screen porch, gas fireplace, and the best views from the south end of Lake Coeur d'Alene.



**Rocky Point Cottage:** Located just off the Rocky Point Day Use Areas, with a playground, boardwalk, boat launch, marina, Cedar Loop hiking trail, and the Rocky Point Lodge. This facility has central heat and air conditioning, deck, charcoal grill, and a washer and dryer.



**Keepers Cottage:** This cabin was built as the bridge tender's cabin in 1924 to control the swinging bridge just north on the Trail of The Coeur d'Alenes. Enjoy unprecedented access to the Trail of The Coeur d'Alenes and the Chatcolet Marina. Situated just above the trail and lake, you won't get closer to lake life than staying here. All rentals include secured overnight moorage at Chatcolet Marina. Even better, this cabin has air conditioning for those hot summer days and a gas hearth for those cozy winter getaways.

## Rocky Point Lodge



**Rocky Point Lodge** offers the following amenities:

- Seven bedrooms with sleeping space for up to 14 people; 10 upstairs and 4 downstairs
- Full living room with gas fireplace and couches
- Downstairs is fully ADA accessible
- Private sinks in each bedroom
- Three bathrooms with showers facilities
- Full kitchen stocked with pots/pans/dishware
- Main meeting area with max occupancy 49; folding tables and chairs for capacity
- Built in dining booths, plus bar tables for seating on covered porch

The focal point of Rocky Point Day Use area, this lodge is perfect for day or overnight get-togethers of up to 49 people. Built around 1940, it is Idaho's most impressive surviving example of the Civilian Conservation Corps' lasting impact on our country.
