Pygmy Short-horned Lizard

(Phrynosoma douglassii)







How to Identify:

- They are smaller than greater short-horned lizard, pygmies are about 1.3 to 2.5 inches long.
- They have short legs and flat bodies.
- They have spines that crown their head and along their back.
- They have one row of pointed scales around their body but the rest of their scales are flat.

Habitat:

- They are found in the northwest
 United States and southern British
 Columbia.
- They range from semiarid plains to mountainous areas.
- Can be found in prairies, sagebrush deserts, and forests.
- In City of Rocks National
 Reserve, they have been found in the sagebrush-covered valleys, like south of the Twin Sisters.

Help Protect the Pygmy Short-horned Lizard

- Stay on designated trails when hiking or biking. Pygmy short-horned lizards are very good at hiding in plain sight!
- Do not drive ATVs or other vehicles where not permitted.
- Protect habitat from encroaching agricultural and urban development.
- Do not keep wild lizards as pets.
