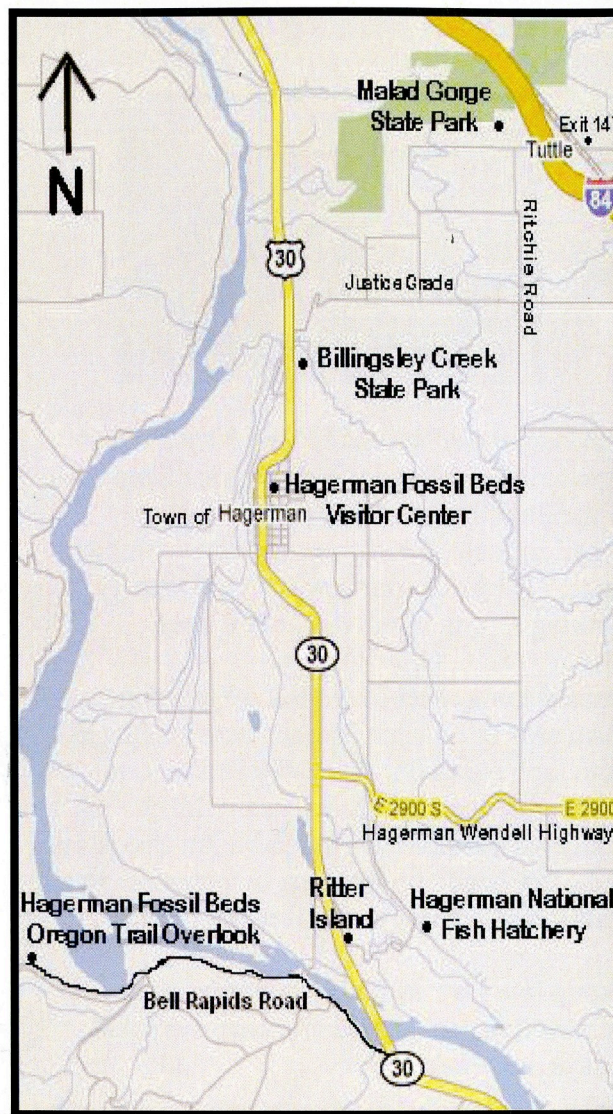

Hagerman Fossil Beds National Monument offers a variety of free, curriculum-based, ranger-led programs for students, kindergarten-8th grade, concerning fossils or the Oregon Trail.

Teachers and students will discover a new dimension in learning beyond their classrooms. Park staff can present formal guided programs or help you plan a special program. Programs meet Idaho State Standards in Science and Social Studies and help satisfy teacher and student courses of study so each field trip has purpose and relevancy.

As today's students become tomorrow's leaders, it is hoped they will become stewards and help preserve and protect our National Parks.

Experience "New Life"



The Hagerman National Fish Hatchery rears threatened steelhead which migrate from Idaho to the Pacific Ocean and return. Come experience steelhead from the egg to smolt stage, visit fresh spring water, and take a walking tour that will delight all ages.

Guided tours meet Idaho State Teaching Standards in Science. Learn about steelhead, trout, and sturgeon. Study the Snake River Aquifer, nuisance species, and wildlife. Educational trunks are available for check out and offer hands-on learning in topics of: water, plants, fish, geology, & animals.

Group tours are available by reservation. Interpretive self-guided tours are available 7 days per week.

Explore Your Parks



THOUSAND SPRINGS STATE PARK

Thousand Springs State Park has much to offer Idaho students, with programs that meet State Teaching Standards in Geology, US History and Idaho History.

Malad Gorge- step back in geologic time to the creation of the gorge. Walk along the historic **Kelton Trail**, learn about animal species found within the park, water usage and native plants, including a **rare** plant found in only four parts of the state.

Tour **Billingsley Creek** State Park to learn first-hand about wetlands and their importance or visit historic **Ritter Island** to experience a 1920's dairy located there.
